Is it possible to have a child and retain one's own identity?



Days of the Hyena is a precise and straightforward story about a 40-yearold artist, about childlessness and the contradictory nature of having a

child. It depicts the hopes for a child and the unpredictability of procreation, the shame related to one's body, and the demands placed on the female body. The novel delves into the incompatible ideas **between artistry and motherhood** but, above all, it depicts the **physical dimension** of having a child. At childbirth, the atmosphere of suffocation gives birth to **a hyena** that lives within the woman and lives through the moments of animality for her. The novel explores physicality and empathy, how fragile a human being really is, and how important compassion is. The narration flows effortlessly and takes the reader to a fascinating world of both personal and universal questions.

Tommi Kinnunen has been praised for giving a voice to people whose **stories have been kept untold**: **In 2001**, three elderly siblings, Martti and the twins Eeva and Marja, meet in a small village in **Northern Finland**. Their mother Laina, an old woman who has been through the Second World War, is dying. In **1944**, Laina lives with her twin daughters in **Lapland**, right next to the eastern border. Her husband has been killed in the war. In the night, a Soviet partisan unit attacks the village. Laina hides the but is herself taken as a prisoner. The village is burned, the women are raped. Finnish soldiers catch up with the partisans, Laina manages to escape and grabs with her Vilma's terrified six-year-old son. When Laina finds her way back to her home village, she finds her daughters alive but is unable to tell the authorities about what she has experienced. The rescued boy is mistakenly marked down as her son.



MILO - Stalemate is a psychological suspense novel with surprising twists and interesting facts about the game of chess. It's also a story of complex human relationships, sex and issues people are facing when they approach the middle-age. The novel covers a lot of art and cultural references, maintaining the **erotic vibe** that stems from Milo's and Ronja's sexual adventures.

Milo, a 38-year-old art enthusiast, gallery owner and criminal profiler struggles with sexual frustration that are both the cause and consequence for his marital problems. **A body** of a young woman is found **painted in all-white representing a piece of chess**. The chief inspector receives an anonymous letter with a short message: **dxe5**. This indicates a chess move and along the location where the body was found the investigators feel that more chess moves might be on the way.

Milo struggles to form a clear picture of the killer. He soon understands that in order to help the police force to catch the killer he needs to understand the game of chess better. He decides to face the ghost of the past: her mother's former partner Stanislav who happens to be a European champion in chess... *The development and writing process for the series begins in 2024 with the real production starting in 2025.
