


A BIG ADVENTURE

Unfortunately, there is always a war going on somewhere in the world. Whether near or far, the subject is an everyday topic. This story begins in a small way with a quarrel in kindergarten. In Peace Has Broken Out, children join a conversation between a father and his daughter. The text encourages discussion and gives readers the chance to enter into conversation too. After all, what is more important than for freedom, justice and love to have their place in life and remain so? Willi Weitzel, known from the 'Willi Wills Wissen' (Willi Will's Knowledge) and other children's programs, received the Grand Prize of the Academy for Children's and Youth Literature in November 2022.




BELLA & BRUNO HOW TWO CAME TOGETHER




LINDA WOLFSGRUBER,



A philosophical story about finding your place in life.










Max Bolliger THREE LITTLE BEARS




JÓZEF WILKON,

is an illustrator, painter, sculptor, and scenographer. He was born on 12 February 1930 in Bogucice (Poland) and now lives and works in Zalesie Dolne (Poland).

From 1947–1949, he attended the School of Fine Arts in Kraków. In 1950, he began to study painting at the Academy of Fine Arts and graduated in 1955. At the same time, he studied art history at the Jagiellonian University, obtaining a master's degree in 1954.

He is one of the greatest Polish illustrators. He has contributed to nearly two hundred books for both children and adults. Works illustrated by him have been translated into more than 20 languages.


